# After the treatment:

You should try and rest for the first 2 – 3 days after the treatment and avoid any activities that normally worsen your symptoms.

#### How long will it take for the treatment work?

It can, sometimes, take a few days or weeks before any change is noticed, and individuals do vary but most patients report an improvement of their symptoms within 24 – 48 hours. The optimum time to review if an injection has reduced pain and / or reduced swelling is 6 weeks. Please all time to review the outcome and for the injection to improve your symptoms.

# How long will the effects last?

Improvement can last for weeks or months and in some cases, improvements last even longer. There is also no guarantee that an injection will work and other treatments may be required as part of your treatment plan.

### Side effects:

Side effects from low doses used in the treatment are rare, but can occur. These include:

- Pain at the injection site. This happens in approximately 10% of patients. The pain can be quite severe but should settle down in a day or two. Over-the-counter painkillers, such as paracetamol, can be taken, if required
- Facial flushing this may occur 24 48 hours after treatment, but should settle within a day or two
- Fat wasting a small amount of sub-cutaneous fat may be affected by the injection leaving an indentation at the injection site.
- Bleeding
- Bruising
- Fat atrophy
- Skin colour changes
- Infection
- Facial flushing
- Internal damage / trauma
- 1 in 10 people suffer a steroid flare (increased pain for 3-5 days)
- Delayed viral clearance
- Occasionally injections fail to work and you may need more than one injection. In some instances we may need to refer you for further investigation and / or surgery.
